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this book probes the intersection of the beautiful and the ugly offering a systematic framework to understand interpret and evaluate how ugliness can contribute to beautiful art many great artworks include elements of ugliness repugnant content disproportionate forms unresolved dissonance and unintegrated parts mark william roche's authoritative monograph beautiful ugliness christianity modernity and the arts challenges current practices of the dominant aesthetic schools by exploring the role of ugliness in art and literature roche offers a comprehensive and unique framework that integrates philosophical and theological reflection intellectual historical analysis and interpretations of a large number of works from the arts the study is driven by the recognition that though ugliness is usually understood as the opposite of beauty ugliness nonetheless contributes significantly to the beauty of many artworks roche's analysis unfolds in three parts the first offers a refreshing conceptual analysis of ugliness in art the second considers the history of ugliness in art and literature with special attention to its role in christian art and its central place in modern and contemporary art the third synthesizes earlier material offering a taxonomy of beautiful ugliness derived from hegelian philosophical categories roche mesmerizes the reader with an extraordinary range of literary scholarship and expertise with a particular focus on english latin and german literature and with a broad range of analyzed phenomena including fine arts architecture and music

including 63 color illustrations beautiful ugliness will draw in readers from multiple disciplines as well as those from beyond the academy who wish to make sense of today's complex art world

seminar paper from the year 2014 in the subject didactics for the subject english miscellaneous grade 1-3 university of cologne language english abstract the reuse of ideas already in existence be it in parts as a whole or as a basis for further development seems to be a creative practice as old as art itself and is most commonly referred to as adaptation yet the exact properties denoted by this term often remain unclear resulting in either an almost extreme narrowing or broadening of its qualities and leading to an ongoing discussion of its social and cultural value authority and purpose however since the emergence of cinema one facet of adaptation theory appears to dominate the topic's recent discussion in both popular and academic writing namely movie adaptations based on literary originals offering rather striking examples for the practice's challenges and problems but also illustrating the numerous possibilities it provides this paper primarily deals with a special aspect of these discussions the faithfulness of movie adaptations seemingly the degree of loyalty which cinematic adaptations display towards their literary originals functions as the bone of contention in many presumably even most of the often heated debates centered around this part of a generally broad discourse as interestingly non-scholarly audiences and academic writers alike tend to judge an adaptation's quality on the basis of its however generated faithfulness to an original

the charabanc theatre company played a major role in northern ireland s theatrical renaissance during the 1980s charabanc was formed by five out of work belfast actresses marie jones maureen macaully eleanor methven carol moore brenda winter who first collected stories and then collaborated in writing and performing highly original plays for enthusiastic audiences from 1983 to 1995 the company toured twenty four productions extensively throughout ireland and the world spreading their own particular brand of exuberant dark humour the four plays in this collection now you re talking 1985 gold in the streets 1986 the girls in the big picture 1986 and somewhere over the balcony 1987 represent the creative high point of the company these entertaining plays show the broad range of the company s work portraits of urban and rural women early mid and late twentieth century settings and various social religious historical political or personal relations marie jones eleanor methven and carol moore were the remaining company principals during the mid 1980s when these four plays were created and performed marie jones became the main writer for charabanc and after leaving the company in 1990 has continued to write notably the award winning stones in his pockets eleanor methven and carol moore continued on as artistic directors until they disbanded the company in 1995 eleanor methven now lives in dublin and is a sought after actress for stage and screen and her first screenplay is in development with journeyman films carol moore obtained an ma from queen s university belfast and still acts for stage and film but is now primarily an accomplished stage and screen director in may 2005 she received a nesta national endowment for science technology and the arts fellowship
